November 13-17, 2020, several NETABSE representatives and board members attended the National Alliance of Black School Educators (NABSE) Annual Conference in Dallas, Texas. The meeting was held at the Hyatt Regency Hotel where a host of eminent educators from around the United States and Canada engaged in enlightening sessions based on the theme "Empowering Educational Excellence through Equity!" Williams (Texarkana College) who concentrated on seminars applicable to higher education.

The following were the conference workshop focus topics: 1) School Board and Superintendent Leadership; 2) Teaching and Learning the Diverse Learner; 4) Scaling Systematic Equity; 3) Results Driven Turnaround Approaches; 5) Professional Learning Examined. The session "Is My School, Team, Department, Division, or District Better Because I Lead It," delivered by school leadership expert Principal Baruti Kafele, inspired educational leaders to examine why and how they lead. His presentation urged them to give attention to *the correlation between their leadership philosophy and style and what students experience in the classroom*.

NABSE founders were recognized at the Founding Members Celebration which featured musical performances by the Junior Division of the

Dallas Metropolitan Musicians Association (DMMA), as well as by soprano soloist Alfrelynn Roberts. Establishing an indelible impression on attendees was CEO of Educational Epiphany Dr. Donyall D. Dickey's presentation "Transforming Student Achievement through a District-wide Approach to Common Instructional Knowledge, Language, and Tools". His powerful delivery revealed how information should be communicated to students in order for successful learning to occur. In sum, NABSE involvement is to become not only challenged but also encouraged to strive to refine education and further learners' productivity.

Liberty-Eylau High School Career and Technical Education Department 1st Annual Career Fair

The Liberty-Eylau High School Career and Technical Education Department, hosted the first annual Career Fair on Wednesday, November 13, 2019 from 8:30 to 3:30 in the High School Media Center. The event was designed to focus on careers/jobs that can be obtained with less than a four-year Bachelor's Degree.



Organizers used the activity to introduce students to careers related to their high school coursework and to help them identify the key skills needed in order to become a successful professional.

Students were afforded opportunities to develop skills in communication, selfpresentation, and networking, preparing them for job interviews and other professional interactions.

The school plans to make the fair an annual event that will help to develop relationships with area employers, which could lead to student internships, class visits, service-learning projects, and other work-based learning partnerships.

Area businesses were invited to set-up tables regarding multiple job opportunities in their respective industries. Event organizer and LEHS Counselor Doni Watson felt that the fair successfully gave students opportunities to interact with business leaders to help get an accurate perspective and introduction to the opportunities in our local area.

"We were able to provide our students with short presentations from local business leaders and owners about interview skills, appropriate dress, soft skills required in today's workplace." She said. "These professionals were gracious to directly respond to student questions regarding the joys and challenges of their profession and offer them individual advice on required training and Networking for their career choices."
